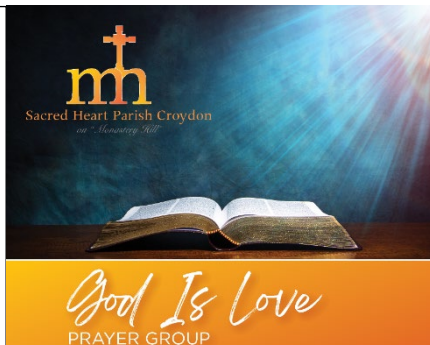

Last Rites

The Last Rites is not a single sacrament, but a
combination of prayers and sacraments. These
ordinarily include Reconciliation, Anointing of the
Sick, and Holy Communion. The purpose of Last
Rites is to offer spiritual strength, forgiveness, and
peace.

Rites are not reserved only for the final moments of
life. The Anointing of the Sick provides "the grace of
the Holy Spirit" for strength, peace, and courage in
illness, it is also not a sacrament that is received only
once.

Families are encouraged to contact a priest as soon
as a serious illness is diagnosed, or when a loved one
becomes significantly weakened by age or medical
condition. Waiting until the very last moment can
limit what can be received, especially if the person is
no longer conscious. Again not to wait until the very
last moment.

At 9.30am mass every 2nd Friday of each month
Anointing of the Sick.
